Dear Carl-Otto Gensch,

Pacific Light Technologies expresses its support of two RoHS exemption requests, 2013-2 and 2013-5 by QD Vision and 3M, respectively. As CEO of the leading manufacturer of quantum dots for on-chip LED solutions used in solid state lighting and displays, I represent key stakeholders in the outcome: that of our customer base (LED manufacturers), system integrators (luminaire, lamp, and display manufacturers), and end-users (businesses and consumers) who will be greatly affected by the upcoming decision on these two requests. I have reviewed the contents of the two applications, and I hope you agree that they are persuasive. I write to you today in support of both requests.

The requests of QD Vision and 3M go far beyond the scope of those two corporations alone. Quantum dots used in solid state lighting applications allow for efficiency increases of 30% or more compared to legacy technologies, which therefore bring an associated impact on energy cost savings and greenhouse gas and pollutant reductions across the EU, including cadmium reductions strictly due to the burning of fossil fuels. As described in the 3M document, a simple calculation demonstrates that allowance of a small quantity of cadmium in an LED product saves an even greater amount of cadmium from being released into the environment over the life of the product from the energy source used to power the LED.

Failure to approve these exemption requests therefore will actually increase cadmium released into the environment.

I hope the information provided here and in the exemption requests are sufficient for deciding *for* the continuance of the exemption for small amounts of cadmium in light-generating devices. Please let us know if you would like any further information on the subject.

By signing this letter, each of us expresses its support of two RoHS exemption requests, 2013-2 and 2013-5 by QD Vision and 3M, respectively. As executives and officers of leading corporations or institutions that are a part of the budding quantum dot industry, we are stakeholders in the outcome as our respective businesses have the potential to be greatly affected by your upcoming decision on these two requests. We have reviewed the contents of the two applications, and find them persuasive. We write to you today in support of both requests.

The requests of QD Vision and 3M go beyond the scope of those two corporations alone. While those two companies may be the first to have products on the market in the EU, we by no means believe they will be the only ones in the coming years. Indeed, in addition to those two companies, the outcome of your upcoming decision will impact planned product launches of other companies that are either direct participants in the quantum dot industry or part of the supply chain of the industry. In many cases, such planned products would fit under the existing exemptions as written. In other cases, these exemption requests represent important precedent to planned product launches in other sectors of the electronics industry, which would require new exemption requests to be submitted and approved. In all cases, failure to approve these exemption requests would cause significant, negative, and in many cases irreparable damage to our respective organizations and valuations.

Hopefully the information and business perspective provided herein will be useful to you in your ongoing review of the two exemption requests of QD Vision and 3M.


